

## Reports were given:

- Treasurer Current bank balance is approximately \$4,000.
- Membership 43 paid members and 8 unpaid members. Deborah will email those not paid.
- Quilt Show Gwen is looking for leads. Thoughts for holding a workshop during the quilt show are being considered. Gwen is involved in the Innovations in Textiles in 2019 and will add CSQ to their list. She will also look into other possible connections to extend our outreach.
- Charity Quilts Betsy Sweeney is working on an idea. Gwen will follow-up with her.
- Newsletter There is a space open in the piecing group. We need to ask the piecing group if anyone is on a waiting list. If not, we need to list an explanation of what the piecing group is and list in the newsletter.

## Program meetings were finalized:

- May: Fundraising Auction with Kevin the Quilter council members to arrive early to help unload cars. A check for \$150 is needed for the auctioneer.
